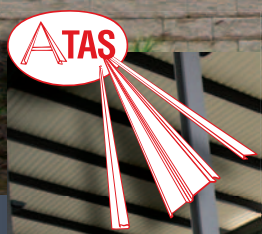

**Dutch Seam & Belvedere Short Rib**  
**Antique Patina & Black**

The Clayton Community Center in Clayton, N.C., brings expanded adult and youth athletic and art programs to the community. Metal wall panels from ATAS International, Inc., were chosen for this building because of aesthetics, durability and cost-effectiveness.

The 24-gauge panels include 13,200 square feet of Dutch Seam (MRD194) in Antique Patina and 1,700 square feet of Belvedere Short Rib (BWK360) in Black.

“We paid close attention to the detailing of the panels to ensure as clean of an aesthetic look as possible,” said Brandy Thompson, AIA, LEED AP, the lead architect for this project with Clearscapes, PA, in Raleigh, N.C. “Both standing-seam metal panels and ribbed metal panels were used. They add visual interest to what would otherwise be flat facades and help depict the different scales of activities that take place within the building.”

The general contractor was Davidson & Jones, Raleigh, and the metal panel installer was Burns & Scallo, Garner, N.C.
